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## What You Do

## 1. Sing the following to the tune of "Oh My Darling, Clementine" before adding questions to the What We Want to Find Out chart for your current study.

You have questions, lots of questions, that you want the answers to. You have questions about [balls]. I have questions like that, too. If you ask them, I will write them. Write your questions about [balls]. We'll find answers to our questions and discover more each day.

- Help the children rephrase their comments and ideas into questions as you add them to the chart, e.g., if a child says, "Some boxes are square, and some are round," you could write "What shapes can boxes be?" on the chart.
- Revisit the chart often to add children's questions throughout the study.
