





Empowering Families: Supporting Learning


While students are working at home, **we need your help** to observe and capture those important moments for us!

Where you see "attachments" are the photos and videos. You will be able to see them in color. Additionally your child's teacher may write the story of the task and examples of next steps for learning.

Charlotte is clearly bright and eager to learn. Her fine motor writing skills (she wrote her name) appear honed. We want to encourage her to label more of her drawings and write the stories of her pictures, beyond writing her name. Her verbal skills are great! She was able to name MANY parts of her self-portrait and spoke clearly and with conviction.

The Art of Counting...Parents and children learning together.



"Hi Miss Katie. For the week of 9/21-9/25, we did the following gross motor activities with Lorelai and let her choose various learning centers each day (Cosmic Yoga, Name Hop Activity, Kick the Cup (with shapes)). Lorelai really liked the Cosmic Yoga and will continue to do that as often as possible. She does well with counting and identifying shapes, but we are still working on spelling and recognizing words. The Name Hop Activity was helpful and she really enjoyed. She prefers to play the learning games in the centers, but also likes the videos you provided in the color rooms. We are also trying to get her to focus more and not be as distracted during the larger group sessions. This upcoming week we will do more of a mixture of learning centers and the curriculum you provided on Teaching Strategies, but we believe this week Lorelai will be absent from school for a few days. We will make sure to work on the at home curriculum on the days that she is absent. Please let me know if this is the kind of information you are looking for in the weekly observations! Moving forward we will also include videos and pictures."
